<i>Acer saccharum</i>	Sugar Maple	Sap-maple syrup
<i>Allium tricoccum</i>	Wild leeks	Roots, leaves
<i>Amelanchier spicata</i>	Running shadbush	Fruit
<i>Aronia melanocarpa</i>	Black chokeberry	Fruit
<i>Betula papyrifera</i>	White birch	Sap-birch syrup
<i>Carya ovata</i>	Shagbark hickory	Nuts
<i>Corylus americana</i>	Hazlenut	Nuts
<i>Fragaria virginiana</i>	Strawberry	Fruit
<i>Gaylussacia baccata</i>	Huckleberry	Fruit
<i>Prunus maritima</i>	Beach plum	Fruit
<i>Sambucus canadensis</i>	Elderberry	Fruit, Flowers
<i>Vaccinium angustifolium</i>	Lowbush blueberry	Fruit
<i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i>	Highbush blueberry	Fruit
<i>Vaccinium macrocarpon</i>	Cranberry	Fruit
<i>Vitis labrusca</i>	Fox grape	Fruit
<i>Vitis riparia</i>	River grape	Fruit
